Friends and NCL: A Lasting Partnership



NCL members generously volunteer their time in support of two important Friends of the Libraries-related efforts. The Book-Go-Round, a beloved local bookstore run by the Friends of the Saratoga Libraries, offers a diverse collection of used books for readers of all ages. NCL volunteers play a crucial role in maintaining the bookstore, organizing shelves, assisting patrons, and ensuring a

welcoming environment for book enthusiasts.

The Friends' quarterly paperback book sales provides another avenue for the NCL volunteers to engage with the community. These sales offer affordable reading options and contribute to the funding of library programs, resources, and events. NCL members actively participate in the setup, organization, and execution of these sales.

The longtime relationship between NCL and the Friends of the Saratoga Libraries not only fosters a






Children's Tree

The NCL Saratoga-Los Gatos Chapter began working at the Book-Go-Round in 2003 and was later joined by a second local chapter, the Heritage Oaks Chapter. NCL mother-daughter pairs regularly work on Saturday and Sunday afternoons.

Kristin Gragnola, the Book-Go-Round Retail Manager, appreciates this "great partnership" and often calls on mother-daughter pairs to cover extra shifts. She is grateful for the consistent, reliable, and hard working NCL volunteers. During the pandemic, NCL volunteers kept the BGR open for business by covering all of the store shifts. Kristin said, "They kept us going during the pandemic. Their effort was huge."

NCL mothers report the benefits of volunteering with their daughters. Caroline Schuyler, past philanthropy liaison for the NCL Saratoga-Los Gatos Chapter, donated countless hours at the BGR working alongside her two daughters. Caroline recognizes the value of their time spent volunteering together. She said, "My daughter and I enjoyed working at BGR, not only because we could spend some time together, but because we love books and helping the customers with their purchases, including teachers who were buying




books for their classroom. My daughter also loved giving suggestions to children and other teens, given that she is an avid reader."

National Charity League, Inc. is a philanthropic organization that fosters mother-daughter relationships through community service, leadership development, and cultural experiences. The Saratoga-Los Gatos and Heritage Oaks chapters each have nearly 300 mother and daughter members in grades 7-12. Outside of their significant contribution to the Friends of Saratoga Libraries, these members contributed more than 12,000 hands-on volunteer hours to more than 50 local and national philanthropy partners last year alone.



There is a virtual event for *All We Can Save* on Sunday, February 11.


One Green Thing by Heather White

The Light Pirate by Lily Brooks-Dalton



The Forest Man


by Anne Matheson (Grades 1-4)

After years of harsh monsoon seasons, a forest on the river island of Majuli is in danger of being slowly washed away. Jadav, a boy living on the island, is determined to save the forest he loves. This is the true story of how one young



boy dedicated his life to creating and cultivating an expansive forest that continues to grow to this day. In a world impacted by climate change, Jadav Payeng's inspirational story shows how one person's contributions can make a difference in helping to save our environment.

Two Degrees by Alan Gratz (Grades 4-8)



When three children endure separate climate change disasters – a wildfire in the California woods, a close encounter with a hungry polar bear in Canada, and a massive hurricane in Florida – they emerge from their experiences committed to changing the world.

Don't Call Me a Hurricaneby Ellen Hagan (Teen/Young Adult)



Told in verse, seventeen-year-old Eliza, an environmental activist, is navigating the after-effects of a hurricane that devastated her coastal town while falling for Milo, a rich tourist who is at the center of a redevelopment that could put her community in danger – again.
